Q: When did Red Ribbon Week first start?

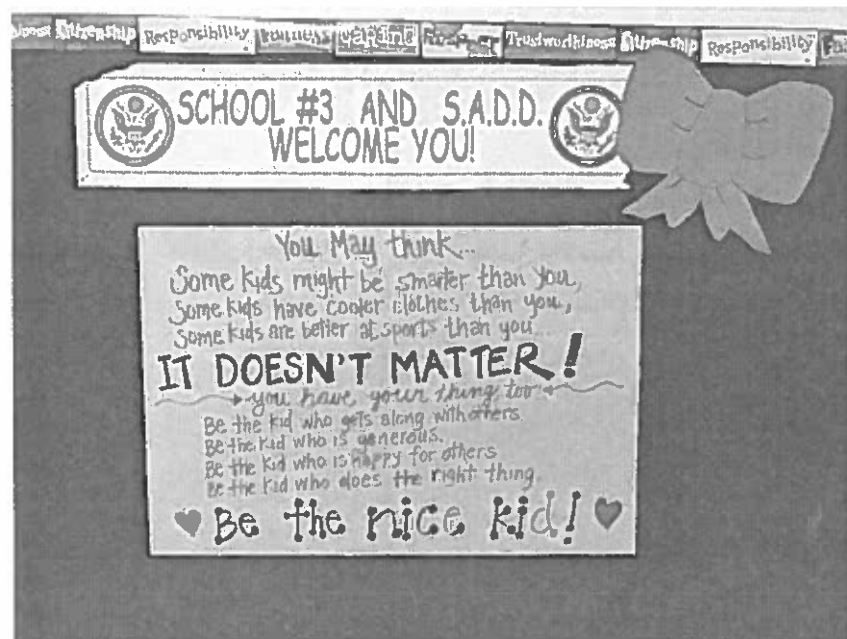
A: No idea, but I have been doing it as long as I have been working here, which is 17 years.

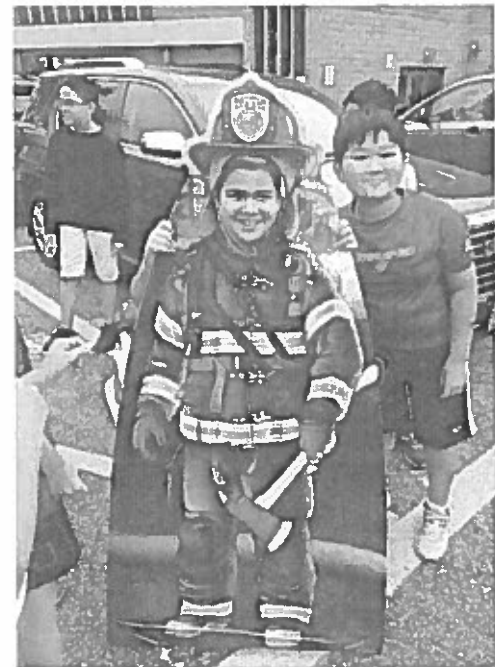

It was originally called School Anti-Violence week, but it was changed. This week was invented because kids felt too exposed to violence anti-media and aggressive video games.

These are some great activities that schools can practice:

- "Create a 'peace graffiti' wall – line a brick wall with white or brown paper, add brick lines and ask student, teachers and parents to write a peaceful message in each brick."
- "Review local newspapers to find examples of kindness or lack of kindness – create a collage of pictures and words that demonstrate a kind and safe environment."
- "Include articles on kindness in school newsletters."
- "Design a bulletin board on peaceful behaviors – post images of peace, peace-related quotations, 'peace heroes' (e.g., Ghandi, Martin Luther King, Mother Teresa, etc.)"
- "Ask the librarian to collect and display books and other print and non-print materials on peace and kindness – novels, picture books, recordings, videos, non-fictions books, and periodicals."
- "Create a 'Thoughtful Deeds Tree' – each time a student demonstrates kindness, post a leaf with the student's name and action of kindness."
- "Have a 'Peace Day' where students do face-painting, wear blue and white ribbons, wear peace-related tee-shirts, make peace-related bracelets or key chains."
- "Give each student a 'Peace Passport' (a small blue notebook decorated with the Peace Week logo to carry with them all week); others write peace-related messages in the notebook or a note of thanks when the student does an act of kindness; students share their notebooks on Friday of Peace Week."
- "Hang signs or banners in the school promoting Peace Week"
- "Include a peace-related 'Quote of the Day' in school announcement."
- "Show films on peace themes."
- "Hold a "'Day of Community Service' within peace week, focusing on a neighborhood need."

National News

The Life and Legacy of John McCain By Eugene Hwang and Shashank Ranga

John McCain was an American senator for Arizona and a veteran of the Vietnam War. He made numerous bills to regulate the amount of torture used on humans. However, this magnificent figure sadly died on August 25, 2018.

John Sidney McCain III's story begins on August 29, 1936, at Coco Solo Naval Air Station in the Panama Canal Zone. He was the second child of naval officer John Sidney "Jack" McCain Jr. and Roberta (Wright) McCain (who is still alive!). For education, McCain entered the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis following his father's and grandfather's footsteps.

During his life of being a soldier, he was assigned to fight in the Vietnam War. Then, on October 26, 1967, as he flying on his A-4E Skyhawk on his 23rd bombing mission over North Vietnam, he was shot down and fractured both arms and broke one of his legs as he parachuted on a lake. Then, some North Vietnamese pulled McCain out into shore, crushed his shoulder with a rifle butt and took him away into to the enemy's main prison camp, Hỏa Lò Prison. He was then interrogated for information and was not treated until they found out his father was an admiral. He was then given 6 weeks of treatment in a hospital and lost 50 pounds, received a chest cast, and had his hair turn white. After he was released from the hospital, he was placed in solitary confinement for 2 years.

Starting in August 1968, McCain was a target of severe torture. He was tied up and beaten every 2 hours, and he even said that he got to the "point of suicide". He was finally forced to make an anti-US propaganda "confession". He later wrote about this, "I had learned what we all learned over there: every man has his breaking point. I had reached mine."

He was finally released from prison on March 14, 1973. His wartime injuries left him permanently unable to raise his arms over his head. When he returned home, he was considered a war hero and met then president, Richard Nixon. When he retired from the Navy on April 1, 1981 as a captain, he was awarded a disability pension.

His life as a politician began in 1983 when he was elected to be a part of the next group of Republicans and was assigned to the House Committee on Interior Affairs.

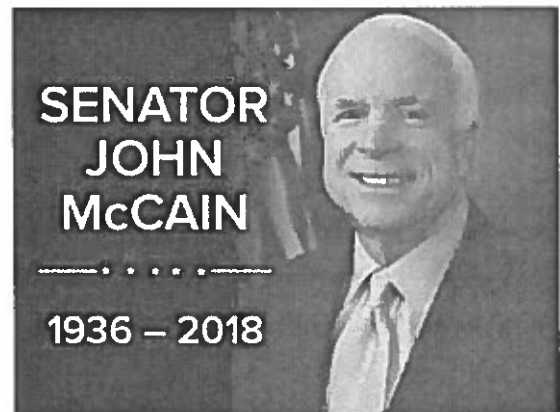
His life as a senator for Arizona began on January 1987 when he defeated Richard Kimball in 1986. As a senator, he became famous for his anti-torture acts. One of his acts is an

amendment to the 2006 Authorization Bill to make torturing acts like waterboarding, sleep deprivation, stress positions, electric shocks, and other torturing acts illegal.

In his political life, he also tried running for the president; challenging George W. Bush in 2000 and Barack Obama in 2008 with Governor Sarah Palin of Alaska. Obviously, but unfortunately, he lost both races.

On July 19, 2017, doctors of the Mayo Clinic Hospital in Phoenix, Arizona announced that McCain had glioblastoma, which is a very aggressive brain tumor while performing the craniotomy, which is a medical performance that makes way to access the brain in surgeries.

On August 24, McCain's family announced that John McCain would no longer be getting treatment. The next day, at 4:28 p.m. MST, or 6:28 p.m. in our time zone, John McCain died with his wife and family next to him at Cornville, Arizona at age 81. Right before he died, he left a letter. On August 27, Rick Davis, a friend of McCain, read excerpts of the letter, which was about America and how the world should not be depressed about his death. We should remember John Sidney McCain III forever. He has made history.



Chinese Tariffs

On September 24, President Trump released to the press a very surprising decision. He said that he will put \$200 billion in tariffs on Chinese goods. In response to President Trump's decision, China had placed \$60 billion in retaliatory tariffs on American goods that they receive. That started the trade war between China and the United States of America.

According to Time for Kids, on September 24, President Donald Trump decided to put \$200 billion in tariffs to China. The reason is that last year, US imported \$505 billion of Chinese goods, but China only imported \$130 billion of US goods.

According to The Motley Fool, "It's disappointing that, despite the voices of those impacted, the administration continues to advance harmful tariff policies that threaten to weaken the US economy," says Matthew Shay from the National Retail Federation. He also warned that these taxes can hurt many retailers, especially since the holiday shopping season is coming up, and many people tend to shop on holidays. Large retailers such as Target, Walmart, and JCPenney had also warned that these tariffs can hurt the businesses.

Walmart has products that are manufactured in the United States, but the products mostly have materials that are sourced in China. The superstore also reportedly says that many of its stores operate not just in the US, but in China as well, and the tariffs could hurt both American and Chinese Walmart prices. Some products in Walmart can hurt lower-income families because the tariffs have increased the cost of some products by 25%, such as car seats, cribs, backpacks, hats, pet products, and bicycles.

Target believes that the same problem will go for them as the tariffs rise. The popular retailer believes as well that prices for basic essentials for families will unnecessarily rise as the tariff increases. Target and Walmart are working hard to make their electronic stores to be the booming equivalent of Amazon's popular e-commerce site.

JCPenney co-signed a letter asking many stores, as well as Target and Walmart to protest the tariffs because it will hurt many hardworking businesses and families with a higher cost for basic needs. However, JCPenney is not in the best position and hasn't been since the last decade, so these tariffs can badly hurt the business.

In the end, these tariffs can have a hard effect on both families and business and throughout the year, it may even hurt stores overtime and lower-income families and more may not even be able to buy basic needs for life.

Hurricane Florence

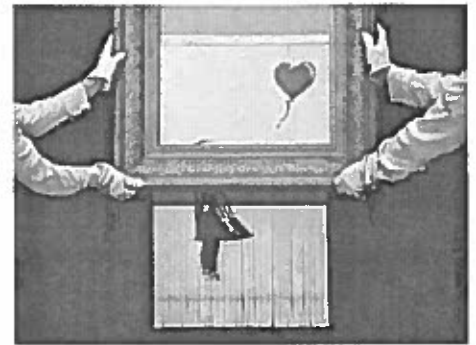

Banksy Art Self-Destructs By Eugene Hwang

On October 5, 2018, a painting named "Girl with Balloon" was sold in Sotheby's, which is a British founded, American multinational art dealer corporation, with a price tag of \$1.4 million or about £1.04 million. Then the unthinkable happened. Right after the painting was sold to a female European collector, it went down the painting canvas, half shredded. "It seems we have been Banksy-ed," Sotheby's senior director, Alex Branczik, said. However, we must know more about the painting itself before we know more about the incident.

The painting "Girl with Balloon" was a 2006 reproduction of the 2002 Banksy-made graffiti named "Balloon Girl" that was drawn on Waterloo Bridge in South Bank which is located in Greater London. It shows a girl wearing black clothing, releasing a red, heart balloon and staring at it, as if it is upset that she released the balloon, on a white background. In the original graffiti, there is a sentence that says, "There is always hope" next to it.



The real meaning of this painting is not exactly known even though there are fine assumptions. One of the guesses is that the girl has a love or innocence of childhood lost. Another guess is that since the surrounding of the girl is white which could mean that hope is surrounding the girl and even in the darkest part of life, made by the dark outline, there is hope.

Now back to the shredding incident, the next day, Banksy uploaded a video that shows him, or someone in his signature hoodie, make a shredding painting canvas "in case it was ever put up for auction." It then shows an anonymous person filming the painting being shredded. There are theories that the person that was filming is actually Banksy himself.

The ironic fact is that the shredded painting could be worth more than before. The painting is known as the first painting to be made during an auction. The new artwork was renamed "Love is in the Bin" with the content of Banksy on October 11. Branczik said, "Banksy didn't destroy an artwork in the auction, he created one."

A few days later, Banksy posted a new video that shows that the painting was supposed to be shredded all the way, not halfway. It is shown that the shredding mechanism worked perfectly in practice modes but malfunctioned in the auction.

We will always remember the painting and Banksy's prank. Banksy is very creative with handling and creating art and graffiti. Who knows when we will be "Banksy-ed" again?

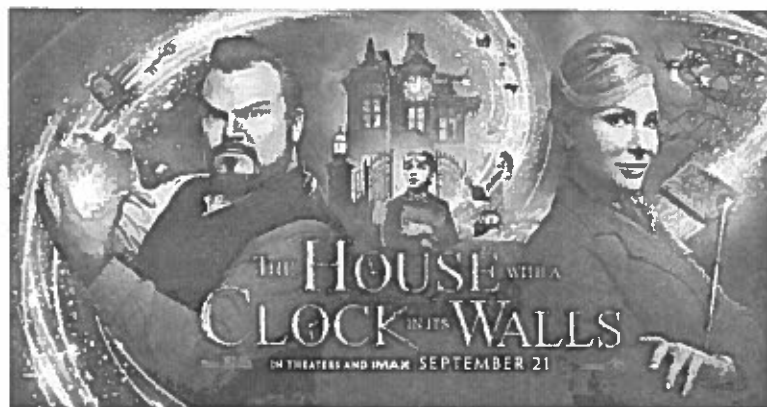
A new Universal Pictures movie was released on September 21, 2018. "A movie combined with friendship, comedy, family and fantasy."

In my honest opinion, this movie was an amazing, suspenseful, creepy and fun adventure!

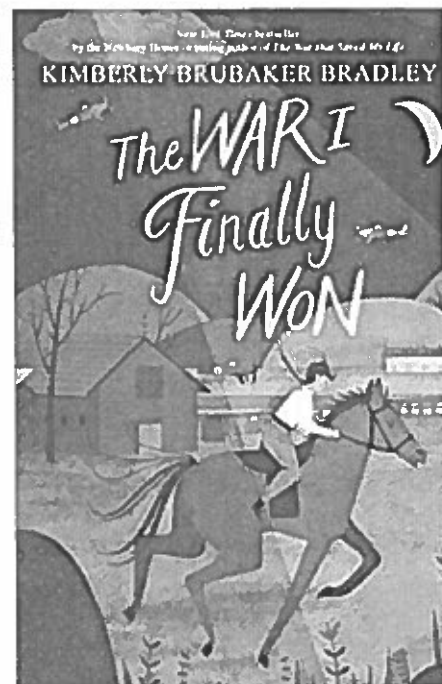


The War I Finally Won Book Review

Ada and her seven-year-old brother Jamie move with their guardian, Susan, into a cottage. The cottage belongs to Lady Thornton and her daughter Margaret. Later, they move in with Ada and her new family.

Life in the crowded house is tense. No one thought it could get worse until it did. Ruth, a Jewish girl from Germany, moves in with them. Everyone thinks she is a spy, a little mole gathering intellect for Germany. However as time goes on, Ruth becomes like a sister to Ada. They share many interests like riding and school. They also laugh and talk to each other for hours on end. After a while, no one thinks that Ruth is a spy anymore. She is now treated like family. This novel of historical fiction tells us Ada's journey of family and faith that began with Kimberly Brubaker Bradley's first book of the series The War That Saved My Life and proves to us that freedom isn't the ability to choose, but the audacity to make the right choice.
